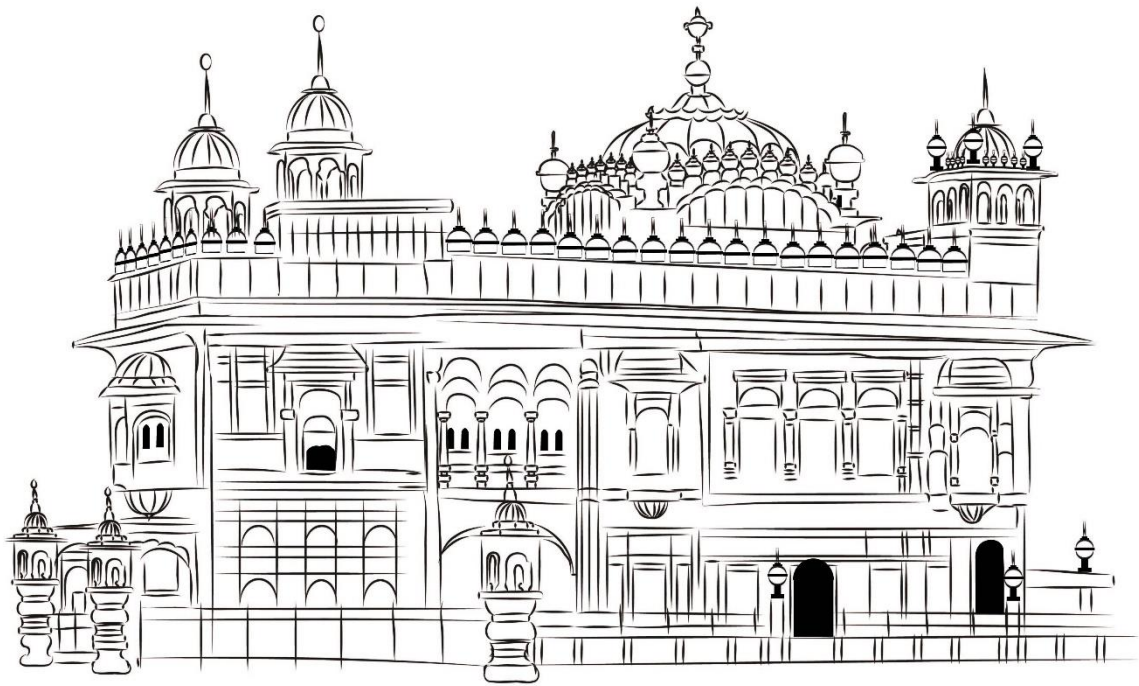

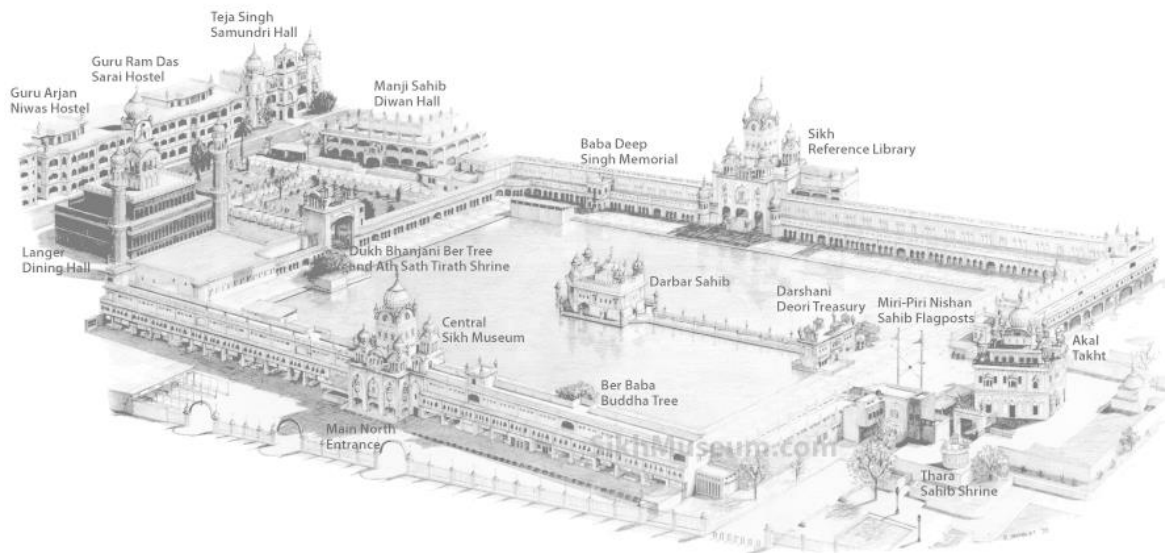

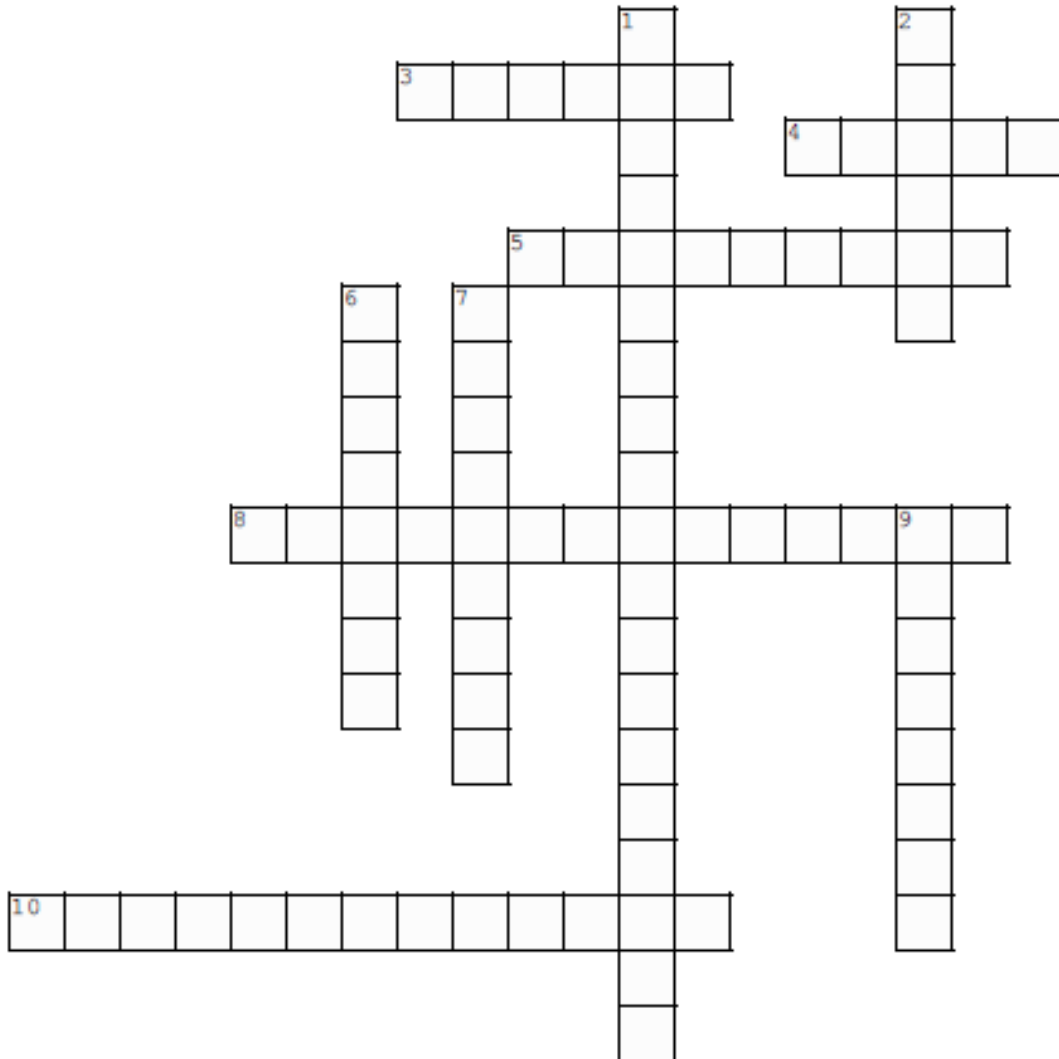

The Golden Temple Crossword

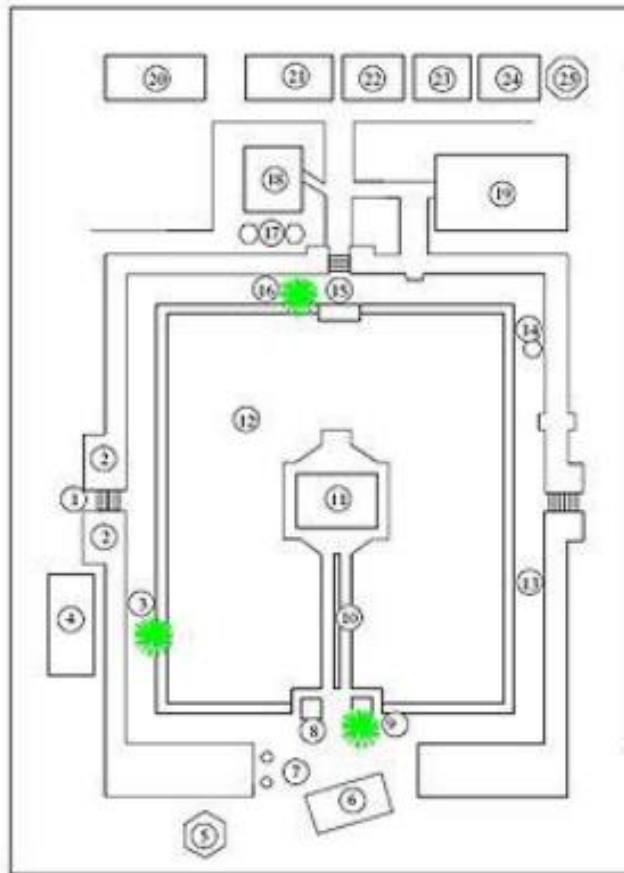
